Homework Timetable

At the start of every academic year, the children are given a zip wallet to keep all of their homework books in. These items should be kept in their briefcase at all times.

The same homework subject is set on each day across all classes in Upper School. This helps all parents, carers and children to follow a set routine and ensures a consistent approach across the academic year. It also means that the adults running homework club know what homework has been set and can support children accordingly.

Monday	Punctuation and Grammar – <i>Schofield and Simms workbook</i>	Wednesday
Tuesday	Maths – <i>Blue exercise book</i> (activities matched to current unit)	Thursday
Wednesday	Comprehension – <i>Purple exercise book</i> (activities stuck in) First News https://ihub.firstnews.co.uk/ Set alternate weeks	Friday
Thursday	Verbal & Non Verbal Reasoning – <i>CGP workbooks</i>	Monday
Friday	Spellings – <i>Yellow exercise book</i> Handwriting practice completed on the printed sheet. Sentences using the words in their context written in spellings journal. A grammar tool may also be supplied to support grammar and structural development, for example: Aim to include at least one correctly punctuated fronted adverbial. Other activities may occasionally be included.	Monday - test Friday. <i>This gives time for homework to be marked and returned to children to correct any errors and continue their practice before their test.</i>
Additional:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Online book reviews</u> should be completed as soon as possible after finishing your book. https://themount.slls.online/ - <u>Reading</u> - at least 10 - 15 minutes three times a week (to an adult at home whenever possible and recorded on GoRead). - <u>TT Rockstars</u> – sessions set weekly to reflect the times tables your child is working on in class. Competitions run throughout the year. https://trockstars.com/ 	Ideally one per week as and when your child finishes reading their book.
